

COURSE LEVELS — 5th digit of course code

Academic — D

- Focus on development of knowledge and skills through theory and abstract thinking as a basis for future learning and problem-solving.

- Prepares students for grade 11 & 12 courses at the university, university/college and college levels.

Locally Developed—L

- Courses that are developed locally to meet educational and career preparation needs of students.

- Prepares students for grade 11 & 12 workplace courses.

- Only available in Math at MPC.

College — C

- College preparation courses provide students with the knowledge and skills needed to meet the entrance requirements for most college programs and possible apprenticeships.

- Emphasis on concrete applications and development of critical thinking and problem-solving skills.

University — U

- Provide students with the knowledge and skills needed to meet entrance requirements for university study.

- Emphasis on theoretical aspects of course content with supporting ap-

Applied — P

- Focus on essential concepts and development of knowledge and skills through practical applications and concrete examples.

- Prepares students for grade 11 & 12 courses at the university/college or col-

Open — O

- Designed to broaden students' knowledge and skills in subjects that reflect their interests.

- Courses do not have specific requirements and prepare students for active participation in society.

Mixed — M

- University/College preparation courses are offered to prepare students to meet the entrance requirements of certain university and college programs.

- Focus on both theory and practical applications.

Workplace—W

- Workplace preparation courses prepare students to move directly into the workplace after high school or to be admitted into select apprenticeship programs or other training programs in the community.

- Focuses on practical workplaces skills.

- Only available in Math at MPC.
